OUR STORY

Our story began with one family physician's desire to spread a message of hope...

Dr. Jeff Harries provided medical treatment for patients with Alcohol Use Disorder for many years. And yet, it wasn't until he attended a 2017 healthcare conference that he learned that a majority of patients and providers across Canada didn't have access to the latest proven and effective medical treatments for Alcohol Use Disorder. He saw this knowledge and practice gap as a challenge and a call to action.

That call to action resulted in the formation of the Canadian Alcohol Use Disorder Society (CAUDS) in September 2020 to advocate for a compassionate, evidence-based, approach to treating Alcohol Use Disorder. Dr. Harries died from complications of ALS in 2021, and we are inspired to continue his legacy and implement a national strategy to transform lives across Canada.

CAUDS is a non-profit society dedicated to ensuring that we recruit board members that support and promote excellence in governance.

- Respect the experiences of all who bring their voices and lived experiences to the board and into the organization.
